Our Program: Mercy College's Occupational Therapy Assistant Program has been consistently delivering excellent professional education to a wide range of students. With pride, we can state that we have produced 525 successful graduates since 1998 and have been contributing to the Tri-State healthcare workforce by providing a strong and crucial pool of Certified OT Assistants. Our two-year Associate's program remains committed to maintaining the high standards and diversity of our student body.

Designed for adult learners who are considering a career transition, our two-year associate in applied science degree offers flexible part-time or full-time evening courses. We provide Level I fieldwork which is closely tied to our primary clinical courses and can be experienced through either simulated or in-person contexts. Additionally, Level II fieldwork opportunities are available during the Summer and Fall terms at various community, adult, geriatric, behavioral health, and pediatric sites.

Students enrolled in our OTA program also can transfer up to 61 out of 68 credits towards Mercy College's Bachelor of Science degree in Health Sciences. This program is particularly beneficial for those who are pursuing the pre-OT track.
